

Allow me to share some information about myself. I retired the end of January 2019 after forty years of full-time ministry, thirty-five of those years serving St. John's in Sidney.

You will notice that I use a cane to get around. I have neuropathy in my feet, a result of medicine and a kidney transplant nineteen years ago (my wife was my donor). This past December, I had my thyroid and three and a half of my parathyroids removed. They were a mess, and this is the best I have felt in a few years. If you have questions, please do not hesitate to ask. When it comes to health, I have no secrets.

Finally, during my time of service, please understand I have no involvement in the call process, other than praying for you and the process. For me, it is a blessing to serve you and walk alongside you on this journey. I will not make changes on my own; that is not my role or place. You are a strong, healthy congregation; why mess with that!? In fact, your next pastor will be blessed by you.

Calling All People Who Sew! You Can Help Make Surgical Masks for the Shortage

The highly-contagious coronavirus (COVID19) has led to a critical shortage of small particle filtering face masks (N-95s).

From Premier Health Helping Hands:

Lisa Thomson, a Nurse Practitioner with Pulmonary & Critical Care Consultants at Premier Health, created this video to help. If you have already generously created masks from other patterns and materials, we will welcome those.

If you want to donate Personal Protection Equipment (PPE) i.e., nitrile gloves, masks and face shields we will add them with our inventory.

How to make a surgical mask

- 1. Cut out 2 squares of fabric 8 inches by 8 ½, a solid (for the inside of the mask) and a print (for the outside).
- 2. Put right sides together and sew 1 seam on the 8 ½ inch side of the fabric and press open.
- 3. Then, on the long edges of the rectangle, fold in ½ inch and press. You will then iron ¼ inch on each short end and repeat.
- 4. Cut 7 inches of craft wire and bend the ends so it will not poke through the fabric and sew in the folded down ½ inch fold on the print fabric. Sew down the other short end. (the craft wire may be omitted if you unable to obtain).
- 5. Put wrong sides together and make $3 \frac{1}{2}$ inch pleats and cut 13 inches of elastic, cut in half and secure to each corner.
- 6. Sew around the sides and the bottom of the mask (your ends that you previously sewed, where the wire is will remain open). I recommend sewing these seams twice for added durability.
- 7. Congratulations! Your mask is completed!

Note that these masks have the option for a filter to be placed in them, which is essential for effectiveness (vacuum cleaner bags which filter 0.1 micron will work). You may need to find alternatives for materials as ½ elastic extremely difficult to find at this time (some individuals are making ties or using grosgrain ribbon for ties).
